And Job again took up his discourse, and said: "Oh, that I were as in the months of old, as in the days when God watched over me, when his lamp shone upon my head, and by his light I walked through darkness, as I was in my prime, when the friendship of God was upon my tent, when the Almighty was yet with me, when my children were all around me, when my steps were washed with butter, and the rock poured out for me streams of oil! (Job 29:1-6)

Job was a "good-old-days" guy (Job 29). When tragedy struck all he wanted to do was look

back to remember the time he "sat in the gate" and imparted wisdom to those who needed it; when he was a father to the needy; he broke the fangs of the unrighteous; he caused the heart of the widow to sing with Joy...and more. Those were the good old days.

Those days were gone. His life was very different when Job 29 was written. He had lost all his family, his home, his possessions, his wife, his health, his friends and

respect. Children made fun of him, wise men mocked him and he was reduced to sitting in the ash heap (we would call it a "dump" or "landfill") using broken pieces of a clay pot to scrape the black, dead skin off his festering boils.

The good old days may have been good and the memories vivid, but when they become an excuse to simply malign the present or become self-consumed and throw the world's largest pity party, then we have stepped off into sin. Read chapters 29 and 30 and count how many times Job says "I" or "my."

What good does this all do? None! You can't roll back time. It doesn't inspire or make us feel better or solve today's problems. The "good old days" can be very bad for us. They

can hold us back, keep us from seeing the solutions to problems and hamstring our present efforts.

churches through their "good old days" in the middle of the last century. Growth rates were phenomenal. buildings were built. Mission fields were flooded and we looked like we were well on our way to making Christians of all men in this fine country. Those days passed and our world has changed, which, in many ways, would not be a problem, if we adapted as much as God's word allows in order to meet each generation's present situation. Many, however, have not. They grew comfortable. They grew complacent and

then when the changed could be felt they simply harkened back to the "good old days," as if it would help us do the Lord's work or make us more effective.

In this day, especially when it comes to all things spiritual, remember the "good old days," but don't let them become an obsession or reason to justify selfishness or

lack of growth. Don't let them become your "bad old days."

"For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matthew 5:45).

The little girl pouted, arms crossed tight over her chest, and swung her legs in fast succession. "It's not fair. Her dad helped her with that science project. And she won. She always wins. I hate her."

Haven't we all felt that way? We hate to see the bad guys win – the manipulators, the cheaters, the unscrupulous ones who bend the rules to their favor. Life isn't fair. The guys in white do not always ride off into the sunset victorious. Bullies win, crimes go unsolved and justice seems blind.

No life isn't fair - but love isn't

either. Love should not be based on deeds. It is an action, not a reaction. If it was based on deeds, wouldn't we all be unlovable? God tell us we are to love no matter what.

You have heard that it was said, "You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matthew 5:44-45).

The Bible states that to love our enemies is like pouring heaping coals on their heads. Why love our enemies? The answer is simple, yet perhaps one of the hardest things to try and do. Because if we don't we are out of God's will. We cannot be His servant, and instrument of His peace. But the only way we can do that is to ask God to help us.

These things I command you, so that you will love one another.

(Joh 15:17)

Mind you, to love our enemies is not to condone their behavior. Love the sinner, hate the sin. Have compassion on those who mistreat you or others you love and ask God to help you see them as He wants you to see them, or remove them from your presence until you can so you don't become a stumbling block. That is not a wimpy, cop-out love. It takes strength and determination, and a Christ-boosted attitude.
