That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life-- the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us-- that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you... (1Jn 1:1-3; bold added by E.B.)

Have you ever seen a subtitled movie? Just in case you have no idea what I mean, a subtitled movie is a movie that requires you to read the words the actors are speaking on the bottom of your TV, often because the film was written and produced in a foreign language. If you have ever seen "The Passion of Christ" then you have seen a subtitled movie.

I was innerved the first time I ever saw a subtitled movie. My first thought was, "They should warn us that we are going to have to work to understand the movie. When I paid for my ticket I didn't sign on for this." Yet, have seen many subtitled movies since, I have grown quite fond of them and actually will watch movies at home, in which the actors a speaking perfectly good English, with the subtitling featured of my DVD player turned on. Why?

What I have found is that I get more out of it. Having to read the movie and watch at the same time tends to focus my efforts on picking up the minute details of the cinematic experience. I have put more into it so I actually get more out. I have even watched movies that I had previously viewed without the subtitling and have picked up on things that, I realize now, I missed the first time I watched it. To me it is amazing. Some will simply find it annoying and distract-



ing. Maybe you are one of the latter types. That is okay.

Yet, no matter what type you may be, I think there is a lesson for each and all of us here. Often we simply do not listen as we should and we end up letting things fall through the cracks that are vitally important. They may seem like minute details and yet may make up the difference between two radically different understandings. In some way we must focus, especially when it comes to things **like spiritual disciplines...** reading our Bibles, meditation, prayer. Ever get distracted in prayer, lose your place while reading, forget what you have just read or what book of the Bible in which you read it. Maybe your focus is off.

In this day, I urge you to find ways to refocus your efforts. If you are reading the Bible through and you find it difficult, why not try getting the audio Bible and listening to it as you read? Having trouble with prayer? Trying saying your prayers out loud or writing them down or create a prayer journal or having prayer with another person? Find ways to refocus. You miss a lot less and multiply the benefits. You will notice in John's words above that the apostle's success in ministry and understanding was in part due to a total sensory submersion in Christ. They didn't just hear Him, they experienced Him on all levels for focus and depth. Will you do the same?

For the Love of the Truth

"These are the things you are to do:

Speak the truth to each other, and render true and sound judgment in your courts..." (Zechariah 8:16).

The world has smudged the lines between right and wrong. Cheating and lying, in the corporate world and our personal lives, seem to be not only acceptable but encouraged. The Bible, however, sets a different stan-

dard. "Therefore love truth and peace" (Zechariah 8:19).

"He whose walk is blameless and who does what is righteous,

who speaks the truth from his heart and has no slander on his tongue, who does his neighbor no wrong and casts no slur on his fellow man, who despises a vile man but honors those who fear the LORD, who keeps his oath even when it hurts, who lends his money without usury and does not accept a bribe against the in-nocent" (Psalm 15 2-5).

Look carefully at what this person does and doesn't do:

- does what is righteous
- speaks the truth
- doesn't slander anyone
- doesn't wrong his neighbor
- doesn't say anything to disparage others
- despises those who are evil and dishonest
- honors those who fear the Lord
- does what he promises even when it is difficult
- lends money honestly, without taking advantage of those in need
- doesn't accept a bribe or distort justice

Don't you want to be that kind of person? Take time right now to ask for God's power to transform you into the person David describes.
