In Rome, not too far from the turned upside down and many steeple clad, padded pew, ruins of the Coliseum where are embracing Christ. gladiators fought and many Christians lost their lives, there is a small church building that is sort of off the beaten path from most tourism. You won't find it in the tour guides and it is typically not listed as one of the "must see" locations for those visiting. Yet, it is a place of remarkable history.* The church of San Clemente is named for the fourth Pope of the Roman Catholic church who was martyred for his faith. As the story goes, Clement I, had anchors tied around his neck and he was drown in the black Sea during the reign of emperor Trajan around 100 A.D.

The most interesting thing about this church or basilica is that the structure that now stands was built upon a structure that stood in the fourth century, which was built upon another structure and catacombs that date back to nearly the time of Christ. The bottom layer, which you can still gain access to today, was a place where early Christians gathered to worship is secret, hiding out from the heavy hand of Rome and emperors like Trajan and Nero and Domitian. In places like this the early church gathered and "had all things in common" and "received their food with glad and generous hearts" and "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship and and cultured, but love less with breaking of bread prayers." fourth century level, one notes very clearly that the building is much more refined. It is not a private dwelling made up of claustrophobic catacombs, but has been expanded into a church building. And yet as history marches on (Christianity now legalized since Constantine in 313) we see the church actually moving toward apostasy and decline in the form of formalized, pharisaic legalism.

Moving upward, from the roots of the cellar, we see the final level, a basilica full of frescos and statuary and ornate designs and masterfully carved trimmings. It is marble and gold and is an awesome sight to behold even in pictures, though it is considered one of the minor basilicas. This is the church refined. This is the church in all its glory and the church has never been weaker and held less influence in this part of the world.

As we moved away from the basement and catacombs we have created a glittering, idealized, glamorized version of Christianity that I fear is far from what God has intended. We may have more education, but proclaim the word with less power. We are more civilized and barely ignited embers of zeal. sion in Christianity. The world is while living in the safety of our

halls, but have grown compla-Moving upward, however, to cent and comfortable in fulfilling our mission beyond making us and our own comfortable.

> The solution? We need not pray for persecution or shed our modern technology or give up the pads in the pew. What we need is to continually remember that the cross of Christ wasn't a convenience. If you are too busy to be here, then it's time to go back to the catacombs and cross. If your heart is just not into the worship and you find yourself murmuring and complaining because things just don't seem to fit your pampered need for comfort, then it's time to go back and remember the roots of Christianity. It is time to open His word and begin to take it serious rather than act as if it is a laborious intrusion to your overwhelming day that is full of things you call "essential," but are not. It is time to get serious about your ministry. Its time to go back to the root cellar and remember that a savior died for you, not so that you could be apathetic and serve him in a lackluster way, but that you might worship and pursue Him in all ways with all your heart. It is time to find that attitude that in any age and circumstance would say, "Make me great at your great commandments" and commission.

"The God of our fathers has chosen you to know His will and to see the Righteous One and to hear words from His mouth... And

now what are you waiting for? Get up, be baptized and wash your sins away, calling on His name" (Acts 22:14, 16).

In the book of Acts, Luke tells the dramatic story of a man named Saul, a Jew Questions and answers online and a Pharisee who aqgressively persecuted



anyone who was a follower of Jesus. He didn't just cause trouble for those near him, but travelled to neighboring cities in order to arrest people.

On a trip to Damascus, Jesus appeared with a bright light and asked why Saul was persecuting Him. As a result, Saul was blinded for three days, until a believer named Ananias came, placed his hands on him and prayed for him. (Acts 9:1-19)

Everything changed for Saul. He went from persecuting followers of Jesus to proclaiming the name of Jesus as the only way to God. He preached to Gentiles, started churches, wrote much of the New Testament and was eventually killed for his faith.

Listen as he recounts Ananias' words of instruction. "The God of our fathers has chosen you to know His will and to see the Righteous One and to hear words from His mouth... And now what are you waiting for? Get up, be baptized and wash your sins away, calling on His name" (Acts 22:14, 16).

Saul had an encounter with the living God and was never the same. How about you? Just because there was no blinding light, doesn't mean you haven't experienced God's conviction in your heart. You have heard the truth: Jesus died so that you could be forgiven and have an intimate relationship with God.

God has chosen you to know His will, to repent of your sins and call on the name Jesus.
