Be a Truth Teacher!

I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. (Eph 4:1-3)

If you want to stop error, you have got to live truth. It is a brief statement, but a bold one that really encompasses the entirety of the New Testament. Perhaps you are unaware of it, but the vast majority of letters of the New Testament were written to repel a lot of false ideas that were either circulated about Christianity or were perversions of it. Paul especially warns Christians over and over that **"troublesome times" will come and false**hood will be taught and many will be deceived. Yet, Paul is also joined by John, who wrote not only the gospel of John, but 1-3 John and Revelation.

These men, and others like Peter and Jude and James, wrote about false ideas **concerning Christ's return, whether** Christ was God, Gnosticism, church conflicts over false interpretations of scripture, Jewish teachers who tried to pull Christians back to Judaism and much more. Paul and others even name the names of some of them.

Yet, I want each and all of us to realize that while they indeed sought to give understanding of these issues and expose the error of them, the bulk of the material they wrote had to do with living the Christian life. Why? There are several reasons.

First, fixating and constantly dwelling on

the error, draws attention and time away from teaching and living truth. It focuses on the negative rather than the positive. Some folks seem to want to beat the dead horse, thinking it will make him live, when all it really does is waste time. If we simply **teach "truth in love," won't folks have a** clear sense of the wrong anyhow?

Second, it is not enough to simply teach truth, but live it. If we could just get more **folks to live more truth then we wouldn't** have so much error. Sure it is good to offer correction, but at some point they have to know how they are supposed to live correctly. We must remember that the scripture is not just profitable for rebuke, **but for "correction," which means to "set on one's feet" (2 Timothy 3:16).**

Finally, even the child grows up and no longer desires the hobby horse. The more mature we are from Christian living, the less we need to affirm the wrong of others, but simply live truth. Ever notice how children are constantly pointing out the flaws of others or how they can be harsh? Some Christians never get past that point and such childish behavior in an adult is not only unbecoming, but wins no one to Christ.

Is there falsehood? Sure there is and we need to correct it when we see it. However, we are no judge and jury and the best method is still the method of the New Testament letters – teach people how to live righteous lives.

In this day, start with yourself and correct your error by using God's Word and "walk" in righteousness. Then, teach others how to live, setting them on their feet having taken them out of the path of error.

Bringing People to Jesus

"One of the rulers of the synagogue whose name was Jairus fell at the feet of Jesus and said, "Please come to my daughter who is dying. Come Remember, there will be no and lay your hands on her so that she will be healed and *live" (Luke 8:40-56; Mark* 5:35-43).

> The twelve year old girl was not able to come to Jesus. she was too sick. So her father went on her behalf. He brought Jesus to her.



When Jesus, Peter, John and James neared the house, there was loud weeping and wailing. The little girl had died. The situation looked hopeless to all but Jesus. He walked up to the girl's bed, grasped her hand and said, "Little girl, I say to you, get up." Instantly her spirit returned and she stood up and walked around. Then Jesus told her parents to give her something to eat.

Some of our children and friends are like that little girl. They cannot come to Jesus on their own. Maybe they are too hurt, too mired in false doctrine and unbelief. They are spiritually dead.

That's where our prayers come in-we can bring Jesus to them. He understands the problem completely and he's the one who can help them. He can open blind eyes and deaf ears. He can cause the spiritually dead to come to new life. "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26, NIV).

So, let's keep praying for them. Let's keep bringing Jesus to them.
