If only those who live like weeds in our political landscape could figure out the meaning of such an assertion and the far reaching consequences of its power, then our world would not only be different, but also far more prone to uphold a set of values that benefit each and every man's existence on many levels. Unfortunately, those who see themselves as part of what some have called the "ruling class" suffer from the elementary problem of not wanting to be ruled by either the will of the people, those who know better or a godly sense of virtue. At the same time they ask you to let them rule your life through legislation and law enforcement. At best it is inconsistent. Worse, however, is the tendency to create and perpetuate an inbred ideology that some men are simply above the law, while most have no choice but to follow the often inane, immoral or unneeded and burdensome code of legalities that is often studied, but seldom understood, even among those who profess allegiance to it.

This issue lies deep at the heart of why so many Americans are frustrated, and have been for some time, with what we may loosely term "politics." It is difficult, at best, to follow leaders who either make little to no sense or are moving our country and its laws away from any recognizable source of authority with meaning, but instead are using a veil of "public service" as an excuse to impose their authority-lacking will on citizens. They don't want to question and serve. They want to rule without question. Of course, this is the tendency of man. For a moment give some thought to how this often plays out in the realm of personal spirituality. Have you ever had any difficulty giving your will over to God's will? Most of us have no problem letting others know when they are living out of harmony with God or His will. Yet, how good are we when it comes to our service within His will? All too often we want to be the rulers of our own lives, but hold others to a very different standard. It is okay for us to whine and grumble and murmur and be unloving or keep some pet sin of our own around. Yet, when it comes to calling out others for those same things we are as proficient as any lawyer with the law in pointing out not only the loophole that sets us free from the law, but closes it for others.

In this day be determined to let His will be your will in all things. Make God your ultimate source of authority and you will never be frustrated spiritually and neither will those whom you serve.

When I first heard the doctor say to me, "It's cancer," I couldn't quite comprehend that he was speaking to me. As a nurse, I had heard Questions and answers for the doctor say that about some of my patients, but this time he was addressing me. That dreaded C word belonged

to me. How could that be?

The months that followed were filled with surgery and now aggressive chemotherapy. Every time I go to the hospital, I get more stuff to read about cancer. People who know me well, keep asking me "How are you feeling?" I'm grateful for the many kind friends who are praying for me and showing me their loving support.

But I don't want to revolve each day

around the cancer diagnosis. I want to live each day to the full in the power of the Risen

Christ, as normally as I can. So, I plant more flowers, I invite people over for lunch and I ask them what's happening in their lives. I go for daily walks around Mill Lake, and I read interesting books (not about cancer).

And what about the future? I am comforted to know that Jesus has already been there. He goes before me and behind me, He is all around me and within me. His Word says: The steps of the godly are directed of the LORD. He delights in every detail of their lives. Though they stumble, they will not fall, for the LORD holds them by the hand. (Psalm 37:23, 24 NLT)
