Services were over and I was sitting in the foyer of our church building waiting for those who had missed the Lord's Supper at the morning services to partake of this feast when it happened. Into the lobby from the world outside walked a woman dressed in what appeared to be an outfit for running. She made a b-line for the bathroom and waved, as if to say "Hello," to me and my youngest. In less than two or three minutes time she was coming back out of the bathroom, only this time we were in the middle of having our closing prayer. She shrugged and feigned discomfort as she looked at me and then did one of the oddest things I think I have seen in a church building. This middleaged woman flipped like a gymnast across our lobby, up to the door, stuck the landing, waved at me once more and was gone through the door. Again, it was very odd.

Then again, some odd things happen in church buildings, most of which many folks simply do not get to witness because they, unlike the preacher, do not get the opportunity to stand up front, elevate above the audience by four feet or more for prolonged periods of time. They don't get to see the person's bare foot thrown up on the back of the pew for a quick, mid-service manicure. They don't get the see the family that brings their own personal buffet to worship or the sleeping beauties that don the pews. Once an entire family, including mom and dad played a game of tag and had a paper ball fight using our visitor cards while I preached. On another occasion a boxer (yes, the dog) came into our building, jumped up on the back pew, sat a while as if he were listening and

then ambled back out the door.

Other odd things are a little more obvious to everyone. Children have gotten loose from mom and dad and have run about, which I can fully relate to and usually find more amusing than anything else. Once I had a man in the audience "amen" the sermon (state his agreement) using a string of curse words. Yes, odd things happen in the church. But, perhaps the oddest thing to me, which might lie beneath some of these other odd behaviors, is that people can come for the purpose of entering the presence of God, honoring Him and praising His name and yet they never really seem to make it out of the world. They are distracted by the things in the world and overly concerned that the world moves on without them as they engage in but a few distracted moments of worship while they write out shopping lists, balance the checkbook or arrange their schedules. You can see it in the constant disconnectedness, glazed over eyes, fidgeting fingers and disengaged body language. You can almost feel it as there is a lack of concern for truth and virtually no spirit.

It is perplexing to me that one can stand in the Creator's presence and act so little concerned. I offer no explanation for these occasional anomalies. We dare not impute motives here. Of course, that makes it no easier to understand, other than to say, I think most of us have been there at some point – disconnected and distracted before God. Perhaps it is because Sunday and other times of worship are the only times we have come to Him. Perhaps we have simply not taken the time to build the habit of close contact with Him to realize the significance.

Why not instead contact and connect with Him daily? Why not use His word and disciplines like prayer to foster that connection so when we do find ourselves in worship it is not such a challenge to set aside the world and connect with Him. In this day, begin that journey and enjoy His presence daily.


What Is Your Idol?

It is a word we hear often... in athletics, entertainment and there is even a television show dedicated to it. I refer to the word "idol." The dictionary defines it as an image used as an object of worship, a false god, or one that is adored, often blindly or excessively.

Saturday 2 Ch. 28; 2 Any object that becomes a focus of our lives can become our idol.

Some things we may think are Even with the Mexico mis-spiritually neutral really are not. Even things morally neutral, like our career, a sport or any passion other than for God can be our idol. Anything can become demonic when it gains first place in our life.

> What is gaining first place in your life? If it is anything other than Jesus then you need to run from it, for it can lead you into dangerous territory. We are a fool to play with temptation, as none of us are strong enough to overcome sin on our own.



God wants to be first place in my life and that requires me to not let anything, even though good in its own right, to get between God and me. How serious are we to make God first? Are we willing to lay down our lives and good fortunes to lead our enemies to Christ? Do I do what is best for me rather than what is best for others?

How do I demonstrate that God is first in my life? I do it by being where I can best serve to the glory of God and I am closest to Jesus when I am selflessly serving others. Worshiping God is vertical. Serving others is horizontal.

"What profit is an idol when its maker has shaped it, a metal image, a teacher of lies? For its maker trusts in his own creation when he makes speechless idols! (Hab 2:18)

Paul had some good advice to the Philippians when he said: "Your life in Christ makes you strong, and his love comforts you. You have fellowship with the Spirit, and you have kindness and compassion for one another. I urge you, then, to make me completely happy by having the same thoughts, sharing the same love, and being one in soul and mind. Don't do anything from selfish ambition or from a cheap desire to boast, but be humble toward one another, always considering others better than yourselves, and look out for one another's interests, not just for your own."
