Letting Your Light Shine On!

To me, though I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, and to bring to light for everyone what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things, so that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places.

(Eph 3:8-10)

Has anyone ever told you about the stars? They are great and wonderful things that light up the night sky and cause men to wonder and ponder the great questions of life. This is especially true once you get away from more urban areas and the ambient light that pollutes our view of the sky. **There is no better place than in the “middle of nowhere” with a pitch black surrounding to view the star-filled sky.**

However, did you know that many of the stars that you can now see twinkling in the night sky have long since died? Their light persists since it takes so long to get to us, but the star itself has long ago burnt out. Many are aware of this fact, but just the **other day I heard an interesting question asked about it. “If someone were in the space where that star used to be, would they be able to see the light travelling away from them, as we see it coming toward us?”**

The answer, of course, is “no.” In order for us to perceive light it must directed into the eye’s receptors. That cannot be done when the light is travelling away from us at the...well...speed of light. It is an interesting question, but one easily solved by understanding a little bit about how light works. Only if that light were, in some way, reflected back to that star would that person be able to see it.

We too are light and just like the light of the stars we are called to shine forth and never hide that flame. Now, very often as we strive to be light we are unaware of where our light is going, who is receiving it and what impact we are having. We are on the sending end of the light. We may not know who we are helping to transform or convert. By the same token, neither do we know whether or not we are turning folks away or causing them to think ill of Christ, unless it is reflected back to us in some way.

But, folks are not too often good at that sort of thing. Many years may pass before we **realize just how significant an impact we had on someone’s life. Almost an entire life-time may pass before some folks find out that the good deed that thought no one appreciated or the kind word they thought fell on deaf ears was actually heard and had long standing effects on the spiritual lives of many people.** In this day keep on keeping on, plugging away at those light bearing things, regardless of who you think can see. God knows and will take that light and really make it shine.

Praising God In Hard Times

"Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? Hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him, who is the health of my countenance, and my God." (Psalm 42: 11, KJV)

All of us have moments when we feel discouraged by life's circumstances. Sometimes our loved ones' efforts to lighten our load or lift our spirits fall short, and we wonder if we will ever emerge from today's trying situation with our joy intact.

It's good to know that our Father invites us to confide in Him, to share our feelings honestly in prayer. He cares for us and understands our needs and weaknesses. His comforting words, "Be of good cheer," can mean more to a hurting heart than anything else in the world.
