Maybe you have hear the stories recently about the Bolivian man who is supposed to be, if the Bolivian government records are accurate, the oldest man alive today. Carmelo Flores Laura, an illiterate, shepherd, whose eyesight is dim and his memory faded, but able to walk without the use of a cane, still lives with his flock and works every day.

When asked what he attributes his longevity to he simply said, "I walk a lot. That's all. I go out with the sheep." How is that for simplicity? It reminded me of something I recently heard in a documentary about happiness. The documentarians were attempting to figure out why many people in what we, in America, would call "uncivilized" countries of the world have a much higher level of happiness and greater longevity. At the end of it all there were two thoughts that seemed to stick out.

First, simplicity is better for your health. When we can focus on and appreciate the things we have, rather than the acquisition of more and more, then things like our stress, which brings health issues and may lead to reduced life span, melt away. The Bible uses the idea of "serving a master" to relate this point. It says, "A man can only serve one master." When we try to serve many masters and create complexity it slowly destroys us. It is for this reason that we cannot "serve both God and Mammon."

Second, much of what we seek brings only emptiness. Money, for instance, may buy more choices, but it does not buy happiness. I recently had a conversation with a friend about this very thing. Her son is preparing for college and she has been attempting to impart to him some sage advice about career choice. You see, sometimes that choice can take on a how-much-money-can-I-make quality, when that is not really the issue or should be. Instead, she has rightfully, in my opinion, relayed to him that a career must be more than that, if one is to be happy and fulfilled and live a reduced stress, enjoyable life, it must be about more than money. Of course, when we say "more" we are actually talking about something better or more meaningful.
