

"Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying, 'The one I will kiss is the man; seize him.' And he came up to Jesus at once and said, "Greetings, Rabbi!" And he kissed him. Jesus said to him, 'Friend, do what you came to do.' Then they came up and laid hands on Jesus and seized him."

Matthew 26:48-50

It was a Friday and I felt horrible, which is not normal. It wasn't the normal array of allergies and sinus issues which plague my existence this time of year, keeping me awake all hours of the nights with its forced miserableness. It was something else....something deeper...something fundamental. It was simply me.

As most Christians, due to the circumstances of life and ministry I was feeling very unworthy. This, of course, is the quicksand of self-evaluation. You look inside, thinking you will be better than you actually are only to realize the stranger looking back at you is far from what you want to be. You doubt your commitment. You wonder, "What if I had only..." You think, "Things aren't exactly going right and must all be my fault because..." and then list all of your failings.

The danger, of course, is allowing what I had allowed, if but for a moment, to enter my heart – the feelings that I am just not worthy of God's time, attention and work. I let my momentary failures affect my view of the great and gracious power of God.

You see, God wants you to go through this sort of struggle. He wants you to look inward and see the shortcomings, but not with an eye on acquiescing to sin and absconding from life. Instead, His will is that you rely upon Him more fully, rest your faith in Him completely and then act with His wisdom in both life and ministry.

Have you ever noticed that when Judas came to Christ in the garden how Christ, looking at this man who had followed him everywhere, but was now, as we might say, "stabbing him in the back," He still called him "friend." Some say that they believe Christ was being sarcastic, but I don't believe so. Instead, use of this word shows us something very deep within side of Christ. It is not spoken to reflect the acceptance of the errant actions of his disciple, but to display Christ's fundamental attitude toward sinners and humanity as a whole. Judas was in desperate need of a friend, just as we do most when we are living in sin, self-doubt and betrayal of the fundamental principles that guide our spiritual thought processes.

We are never going to be perfect. Even in our failing Christ still desires our friendship and salvation. He loves us. After all, he died while we were yet sinners, so that

Melissa Niven, continues treatment for cancer. Keep her in your prayers.


